

Bridgend County Borough Council

Notice is given in accordance with section 44 of the School Standards and Organisation (Wales) Act 2013 and the School Organisation Code 2018 that Bridgend County Borough Council, having consulted such persons as required, proposes to alter Tremains Primary School, Channel View, Brackla, Bridgend CF31 2NL by:

- opening an autistic spectrum disorder (ASD) learning resource centre (LRC) for a maximum of eight pupils at the school
- It is proposed that the ASD LRC would open in the autumn term 2022.

The school is currently maintained by Bridgend County Borough Council.

The current number of pupils at the school is 408, the pupil capacity at the school is 455 and the proposed capacity once the proposal is implemented will be 408.

Under this proposal, the LRC would be an integrated part of the mainstream school, providing an appropriate environment in which pupils can develop and thrive within their peer group and have normal access to mainstream curriculum, where appropriate. The LRC would provide specialist learning facilities within the school and provide expertise and advice to all staff.

Bridgend County Borough Council will be the admission authority. All admissions to the LRC would be decided upon through an admissions panel.

Bridgend County Borough Council undertook a period of consultation before deciding to publish this proposal. Explanatory Note

The effect of the above proposals would be that the learning resource centre (LRC) for eight pupils with autism spectrum disorder (ASD) at Tremains Primary School would open in the autumn term 2022.

The proposal to open an ASD LRC at Tremains Primary School would afford those children with a diagnosis of ASD the LRC to be part of the mainstream school, providing an appropriate environment in which pupils can develop and thrive within their peer group and have normal access to mainstream curriculum, where appropriate.

The published admission number for Tremains Primary School is 65. The published admission number for a school is the minimum number of pupils in the “relevant age group” (ie the age group to which children are normally admitted) that the school would be required to admit on demand. More children than this number can be admitted to the school (subject to the provisions of the local authority’s admissions policy) if the local authority considers that there is sufficient accommodation available at the particular time and provided that to do so would not prejudice the efficient use of education resources.
